
Helping UC Davis Students Reach Their Potential

"I was very grateful to receive my University Farm Circle scholarship during my time at Davis. The people I met at University Farm Circle actually made several other opportunities possible for me as well, like my participation as a UC Davis Ambassador. In short, I'm still working on my PhD at Stanford in Aeronautics and Astronautics and I am working full time at NASA Ames Research Center.

I started working at NASA Ames as a contractor in January 2018 and then transitioned to a civil servant in July as part of the Pathways Intern Program. This program is allowing me to work as a civil servant full time while I finish my PhD with the hope that I will be offered a permanent position upon graduation. My research is in computational combustion. I use computational fluid dynamics to simulate flames/combustion and look at how they propagate and accelerate. I use super computers to solve these simulations. Most of my free time is spent outdoors enjoying the hiking and camping all around the bay area."

In 1959, these awards to outstanding students were named Marion Freeborn scholarships in honor of the wife of the first Chancellor who was a past president of University Farm Circle (UFC). Beginning in 1980 – 81, re-entry undergraduates also became eligible. Now, these scholarships are funded by the UFC Scholarship Endowment.

Helping students has been important since UFC's beginning. In its second year (1915), Farm Circle established the Student Loan Fund. In those early days, members helped students in times of illness and need as well as provided a home away from home during holiday seasons. The organization also helped fund a gymnasium, band uniforms, and students' emergency health care.

UFC works closely with the University of California, Davis, in identifying and selecting these high-achieving students through an interview process. Each year, in addition to the scholarship, the recipients names are engraved on plaques that are permanently displayed in the campus's Memorial Union.
